Bleeding Precautions for Patients with Low Platelets

Bleeding Precautions for Patients with Low Platelets What are platelets? Platelets are cells in your blood that help stop bleeding A normal platelet count range is 150,000-400,000 Your platelet count may be lower than normal because of the cancer or its treatment Call the Hematology/Oncology clinic at (734) 647-8901 if you have any of these:

Intravenous Immune Globulin (IVIG)

Call your doctor right away if you cannot pass urine Blood Clots Receiving IVIG may increase the thickness (viscosity) of your blood This may increase your chances of getting a blood clot Tell your doctor if you have any pain or swelling in your arms or legs, or where the IV was • Call your doctor right away or go to the emergency room

Questions to ask your doctor about infection risk during ...

About Peripheral Artery Disease

artery, blood can't flow through it the way it should The body part supplied by that artery may be damaged, because it will not get enough oxygen Plaque can also cause a blood clot to form, quickly closing off the artery Or, if a piece of plaque breaks off, it may be carried in your blood until it completely blocks a smaller artery
